EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK



Furthermore we must totally trust that we hand it to God and let him drive the show. "Let go, let God". Similarly, a marriage must be built on absolute trust and faith in one another. Each party has to know that the other, 100 percent of the time, is working for the other in total partnership. These two elements are the foundation of the mansion of a good marriage, next to the keys to get everyone in.

Three keys are needed to maintain our relationship with both God and our loved one. First, never forget to say "I love you". Everyday, upon waking, going to bed, a noon phone call or mowing the lawn, turn and say, I love you. With God, we call it prayer, with our spouses it is a tender reminder of why you got together to start with. Often we get too involved with the day to day living that we forget to say those three simple words. We think that, "they know it, I don't have to say it". Not true, we really do. Just as we need to pray every day, turn to the one you love and tell them. The second key is "thank you". Again with God we do this (or should) in prayer. We need to always acknowledge our blessings in a thanksgiving to the Lord. Simple acts of living during our marriage oft time finds us forgetting to say thank you. And not just for getting a glass of water or a nice meal or washing the car, but just for being there when you need support. I know I'm a pain in the ass, - thank you! The third key is the tough one for so many of us to do is say "I'm sorry". With God we call it confession. It is absolute to admit to God how lowly we truly are and to say we are sorry for falling short of His expectations. With our loved one, we too must remember to say we are sorry for all the little things that happen from time to time. We hope that there are not really big issues necessary to apologize for, but of course them too! We forget to call when we are late, - I'm sorry. We forget to bring home the cleaning, - I'm sorry. We forget to say I love you in the morning, - I'm sorry, I love you and did I forget to say thank you for always being there.

Maintain our relationship with God. Maintain our relationship with our loved one. Be happy!
