


Proposed Policy Changes

POLICY 1 - ANNUAL SENATE PICNIC

7. Host shall provide two comp rooms for both nights for outgoing and incoming **Illinois JCI** Senate Presidents.

Current:

16. Although the Annual Senate Picnic is not intended to be run as a fund raiser, any profit attained as a result of the hosting the Picnic will be split evenly between the Illinois JCI Senate and the host Region organization.

Proposed:
