JoAnn Smith #51107 was like family to me. I was blessed to meet **Jerry #38632** and JoAnn during the summer of 1998 as they hosted what I'd later learn was a Fox Valley Regional in their backyard on Country Club Road. She was welcoming, kind, and funny – just what I needed at that point in my life. Immediately she wanted me to join in the fun of being a Jaycee and insisted that I ride with her to Springfield to my first GA.

Looking back at my time with JoAnn I can't separate it from time with Jerry. They were a true power-couple team. When one needed/wanted to become involved in the Jaycees, the Illinois JCI Senate, or their church, you got a two-for deal in the Smiths. Without preaching, they were a great model to me of what a couple can do to support others while supporting each other.



JoAnn had a heart of gold. She loved her family, the Senate, friends, her Mary Kay team, and their church. I enjoyed hearing her laugh as she'd share stories of Jaycee days. JoAnn never sat you down and told you how times were better then or what you should be doing differently, she just shared what she enjoyed and then was so good at listening when someone else shared.

Many of you will recall her tales with the girls of South Elgin. She was a huge supporter of the entire Fox Valley Region and served as the Region Director. Woodstock became her home when she and Jerry started seeing each other and then married. I think other chapters like Algonquin-LITH, Cary-Grove, McHenry, Hebron, Huntley, and Harvard would easily call JoAnn their own as well. She made friends quickly and showed her support to everyone.

Her fun tales didn't stop with Jaycees. JoAnn was thrilled to be an Illinois Senator. In 2002 JoAnn led the IL Senate with her theme, "Stand Tall, Stand Proud, Stand Out" where she was tickled to share her love of penguins. She was eager to travel and meet new Senate friends. For years I heard stories of the fun Michigan ladies she roomed with, the Thanksgiving dinner during World Congress in Las Vegas, and some crazy golfing advice she received from the guys.

I marveled at how resilient JoAnn was. When Jerry passed away last year it really shook her world. She faced what other widows faced, the loss of her best friend and mounds of tasks that sometimes were foreign, daunting, and lonely. While navigating all of these changes, she decided to step up and get re-involved with the Illinois Senate by working on the silent auction. Her last official office was that of Chaplain. I knew she'd pour herself into those jobs and give all she could because that's what JoAnn did.

When we lose important people in our lives, I think it's important to focus on all that we received by knowing them. With JoAnn, I traveled, planned, recruited, trained, shared, laughed, and cried. She introduced me to **Mark** #39701. My life is better because of my close relationship with both Jerry and JoAnn and I treasure her proclamation that Jerry had kids, she had her or
